Formed in 2013, the Landmark Foundation promotes higher education, and supports the enhancement of the student experience through Landmark Learning alumni giving, fund-raising, grant writing, and charitable gifts.

# Donors, Here's What You Did In 2024

Thanks to your generous support we were able to provide:

These students attended initial Emergency Medical Technician courses, initial and recertification Wilderness Medicine courses, Leave No Trace Educator courses and Swiftwater Rescue courses.

A relationship was initiated with Soul Trak Outdoors, a D.C based nonprofit that connects communities of color to outdoor spaces while also building a coalition of diverse outdoor leaders.

The foundation combined energy with the national Leave No Trace Office to provide Soul Trak with a Leave No Trace Level 2 Instructor course. We conducted this course as a Front-country course utilizing the parks in and around the D.C. area.

Additionally the full tuition for a Wilderness First Aid course was funded for the leadership and participants of the Soul Trak. Wilderness First Aid is a leading safety training requirement for outdoor trip leaders responsible for others.

### **Current 2025 Focus and Initiatives to Share**

Updating the Taylor scholarship for a mission-based fit for service to medical, rescue volunteer responders. As of 2025 this will be the Zimmerman scholarship in remembrance of William "Bill" Zimmerman.

Each of the board members have initiated unique and independent fund raising campaigns to benefit the foundation's mission.

We are in the early stages of building a relationship with the Western North Carolina Wilderness Rescue Fund. It is our design to initiate an annual series of workshops for regional volunteer rescue groups in rural and remote mountain counties of North Carolina. We intend to provide medical, rescue and search related workshops at little expense to the participant or service. Currently we are focusing on June 2025.
